In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four

An act to incorporate Township Number one in the second range of Townships on the west side of Kennebec river in the County of Kennebec into a town by the name of Emden

Section 1, Be it enacted by the Senate & House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same That the Township Number one on the west side of Kennebec river in the second range north of the Plymouth Claim in the County of Kennebec contained within the following boundaries together with the Inhabitants thereon be & hereby incorporated into a Town by the name of Emden beginning at a marked tree on the bank of Kennebec river at the east corner of the Plymouth Claim thence running west on the line of a one six mile to a marked tree thence north six mile to the south line of the Million Acres so called, located on the ~~river~~ Kennebec river thence east on the line of the Million Acres aforesaid about six mile to the middle of Channel of said river thence following the middle of the main Channel of Kennebec River down said river until it intersects a line running East from the first mentioned bounds thence West on said line to the bounds first mentioned.

And the said Town is hereby vested with all the Powers, Privileges and Immunities which other Towns

sec 2 And be it further enacted That any Justice of
the Peace within the County of Kennebec may and
he is hereby empowered to issue his warrant
directed to some suitable Inhabitant of this
Town of Emden requiring him to notify and warn
the Inhabitants there of Qualified to vote in town
affairs to meet at ~~some~~ such time and place
as shall be expressed in said Warrant to Choose
all such officers as town are by law required
To choose in the months of March ~~and~~ April
Annually
